Dene Hand games is a traditional sport played by Dene people where a stone or small object is hidden in one of their hands. Each player gets a rock and hides it in their hands under a blanket. The opposing team's captain will call out which hand each player has their rock in. A correct guess will earn a stick. This continues until one team has all the sticks.

This year, FMPSD launched Dene Hand Games clubs, and in April, CG traveled to the first-ever tournament. Our student Cougars represented us with 2 teams made up of 19 students. They won 2 of their 6 games, but all of the scores were pretty tight! A total of 10 schools competed in this inaugural event, and our students did very well considering they competed with high school students! We are very much looking forward to continuing with this club next year!
