Several classes have been making trips to the Discovery Center over the last few weeks, including Kindergarten, some Grade 5s, Grade 3s and Grade 4s.

The exhibit hall is always a favourite, where kids can learn about the oil sands through the different displays, especially the different examples of how viscous bitumen is, and getting up close to some of the equipment like the heavy hauler truck. The guided programs align with our science program where kids complete experiments in topics such as chemistry or Simple Machines.

The Grade 3s and 4s had the opportunity to use K'Nex to build complex machines that move, learning about the simple machines included in each of their builds. The cost of these programs was covered by the support of our Parent Fundraising Council.

Leader In Me Highlight

Habit 3 is known as "Put First Things First." Individuals who practice this habit prioritize important tasks both in the short and long term and take action accordingly. They engage in weekly planning and take daily action to avoid constantly operating in a state of last-minute urgency.

When you put first things first, you effectively manage your time by focusing on the most significant tasks (referred to as the BIG rocks) and eliminating unnecessary distractions. For students, this means considering their essential responsibilities, such as studying, assisting with household chores, and making time for extracurricular activities. However, it's important to remember that Habit 3 is not solely about work. It also emphasizes the significance of making time for self-care and spending quality moments with friends and family. It's essential to prioritize these aspects as well.
